**Q1** Did you watch all or part of the State of the Union address?

**Q6** President Obama said 'we can choose to believe that Superstorm Sandy and the most severe drought in decades and the worse wildfires some states have ever seen were all just a freak coincidence' or 'we can choose to believe in the overwhelming judgment of science and act before it's too late.' Which comes closer to your view: the major weather events of the last year were all freak coincidences; or these were effects of climate change, and we must act before it's too late?

<i>Hispanic</i> .....	100%
<i>White</i> .....	0%
<i>African-American</i> .....	0%
<i>Other</i> .....	0%

**Q15** If you are 18 to 45 years old, press 1. If 46 to 65, press 2. If you are older than 65, press 3.

<i>18 to 45</i> .....	18%
<i>46 to 65</i> .....	53%
<i>Older than 65</i> .....	28%
